The main Project goal – "Internationalization starts at home" (abbreviated as "Inter-Home") increases the integration process and inclusion of the academic community (Polish and foreign students and academic staff). Welcome Point (WP) established by the previous project, officially launched by the University of Bielsko-Biala on 30th of November 2022 by the Rector of the UBB, dr hab. inż. Jacek Nowakowski and previous Project Coordinator prof. UBB and dr Agnieszka Będkowska-Kopczyk. In 2023, University of Bielsko-Biala received financial support and the possibility of continuation of the Project from the side of Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange. Project starts on 1st of June 2023 and finishes on 31st of May 2024. Inter-Home has created a space for integration and mutual intercultural communication.

The following specific objectives were identified:

1) maintaining and continuing WP activities in the area of service, support and integration of students, scientists and foreign staff;

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2) increasing the competences of Polish students and staff in overcoming cultural barriers and stereotypes, communication, building attitudes of openness, mutual respect, empathy and proper support for people affected by war;

3) increasing the level of integration of foreign students and employees with the local academic environment (students, research groups, local government, clubs of interests, choir) and their effective inclusion in the life of the University.

The project "Welcome Point" has brought a new quality of services offered by the University of Bielsko-Biala to its international guests, regardless of whether they were short- or long-term ones. The target group included: Erasmus+ exchange programme students, regular foreign students, visiting representatives of the universities abroad. One of visible marks of their presence, as the representatives of foreign cultures, are greetings written by them in their own languages on a part of the wall of the L building, prepared especially for that purpose as a part of the project.

2) promoting Applicants internationally, in particular through cooperation with foreign graduates.



The University of Bielsko-Biala

The University of Bielsko-Biala was founded in October 2001 as an independent governmental academic institution. Previously, since 1969, it had been a branch of the Technical University of Lodz (Politechnika Łódzka).

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The machine-design, electrical, and textile industries have an established history in the region, so the main study fields have been long established. However, due to changes in the economy, other fields of study have been developed, including management, humanities, environmental sciences and computer sciences.

At present, about 5,000 students study at five faculties: Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and Computer Science; Faculty of Materials, Civil and Environmental Engineering; Faculty of Management and Transport; Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, and Faculty of Health Sciences. The University employs about 400 people, including 200 experienced professors and other academic staff. As the only state educational institution in the Podbeskidzie region which provides teritary education, the University of Bielsko-Biala has a vibrant community of ambitious individuals who contribute to the University's research and didactic potential by constantly attaining their professional, educational and social goals. The University is firmly rooted in the region which is reflected in various enterprises with members of the community and also in its research interests.

The University of Bielsko-Biala is open to new ideas and opportunities which can be utilised to improve modern educational tools. Internationalisation has become one of the most important objectives of the University, and as a result, it is being constantly promoted through participation in various European network projects.

The University cooperates with many academic centres and research institutes all over the world. The number of bilateral agreements is growing

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exponentially each year – up to now, we have signed over 100 agreements in the Erasmus+ programme, which was created to support education,

training, youth and sport in Europe. Additionally, we have signed approximately 50 bilateral agreements covering scientific and educational cooperation with foreign partners. As a result, the number of students who decide to go abroad to study in a different European country while completing a degree and those who decide to come and study in Bielsko-Biala is growing each year.
